
Dear Brother Knights:

Here we go AGAIN! Another Christmas comes our way—seemingly faster than usual (or is that just because I'm getting older?!) You may agree with me—as soon as Halloween is over, we jump right into Thanksgiving, Christmas and then, the New Year. Our calendar is relentless in keeping us moving from one holiday to the next without much rest. No wonder so many people are exhausted by the time the holidays are over.

It doesn't have to be that way. We **DO** have a choice in how we respond to our society's demand that we move things along at such a quickened pace. We can give ourselves permission to reflect and ponder the true meaning of the holidays. That's the beauty and wisdom of the Church calendar (also called the Liturgical Year). The Liturgical Year gives us ample time to enter into the season s-l-o-w-l-y and to prepare ourselves for the actual celebration of Christmas. Advent provides us with four weeks (usually) to focus on the ways that Christ comes to us—not simply at the end of time or on December 25—but **each and every day**. If we live each day in anticipation of Christ's coming, we will slow down and welcome the actual holiday by already having prepared ourselves for it.

Of course, this is not an easy thing to do. We will all feel the pressure of preparing for Christmas NOW! The choice is ours. We can "go with the flow" or take our time and take control of what is rightfully ours—the celebration of Christ's birth.

He retired in 2006 from Berry Petroleum where he was controller for twenty-one years. He was also a CPA.


He is a U.S. Nary veteran serving between 1966 and 1972. His service included two years on the aircraft carrier Levingston.

2024 LENT FRIDAY DINNERS

If you are like me, there are way too many things to be worried about during the November/December Holiday season without adding Lent and the Lenten Fish Dinners to the list. But Lent begins very early this coming year, and we should probably start planning now. Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, falls on February 14th in 2024. Note, that is also the same day as Valentine's Day. Makes it difficult to fast and take your sweetheart out for a nice Valentine dinner...

As you all know, the first Friday in Lent starts our 6 consecutive Fridays of the Lenten Fish Dinners sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. The following are the calendar dates for the 2024 dinners:

- Friday, 2/16/24
- Friday, 2/23/24
- Friday, 3/01/24
- Friday, 3/08/24
- Friday, 3/15/24
- Friday, 3/22/24

Serving time this season will change a little from past years and will now run from 4:00 to 6:30 PM. Hopefully we can use the additional time after closing, from 6:30 - 7:00 PM, to get the kitchen clean-up completed (and quiet) before Stations begin at 7:00 PM.

So, please mark your calendars and be prepared to sign-up at the January council meeting to support your brother Knights on those dates. We will be running two stations – one at the kitchen window, and the other as a drive-thru by the back patio – just as we have done the past few years. So, we will need 18-22 Brothers and the Pit Masters every Friday to support the effort. As in the past, we will need:

- Set-up Crew: 4-5 men are needed starting around 3:30 PM to set-up and clean tables and chairs
- Main Event: 10-12 (more is better) men to help take orders, serve meals, run dinners to the drive-thru, etc., starting a little before 4:00 PM and working until we shut the kitchen windows.
- Pit Masters: You guys are always self-directed and know when you need to start and how many brothers you need support the effort.
- Clean-up Crew: need 5-6 men to clean-up the kitchen and grounds after we finish serving. Men are needed from around 6:15 to 7:00 PM.
- As always, the LMF will also support our effort by preparing all the dinner orders.

I'm really looking forward to serving our parishioners as we have done now since 2011. It is always a lot of fun and very rewarding to see so many parish families turn out for an excellent dinner and wonderful follows have a low of the second seco

fellowship. Sign-up sheets will be passed around at the January Council Meeting on January 8, 2024.
