

#### FR. PERRY'S FEBRUARY 2025 ARTICLE

Dear Brother Knights and Friends:

Wednesday, March 5, should be on your calendar! On that Ash Wednesday, ashes will be distributed and placed on our foreheads as a symbol of our repentance during the Season of Lent. We will make a spiritual journey of 40 days towards the celebration of the "Paschal Mystery"—Christ's suffering, death and resurrection.

As you probably know, every Friday during Lent, Catholics are to abstain from eating meat. This act of "denying the flesh" is a simple way of entering into the mystery of Christ's sacrifice for us. He denied his own flesh by willingly laying it down on the Cross. Our participation in this act helps identify us with the passion of Christ. Even though it is a simple act of repentance, everyone should find a way of abstaining in some way from the pleasures of life that we take for granted. Any small act of abstinence, done with love, can bring powerful blessings to us.

The Knights assist the parish in keeping this Lenten requirement by having a Fish Fry on those Lenten Fridays. Not only does the meatless meal help us fulfill our Friday obligation, but it brings our community together in a common spiritual practice which can strengthen us as a parish family. I am grateful to all our volunteers who help make this annual tradition possible!

Let us make a conscience decision to embrace Lent in its fullness. By the sacrifices we are willing to make, we will walk with the Lord as he carried his Cross and come to the beauty and joy of Easter!

# SEAS Men's Retreat Report by Ed Knudson

Fifty Catholic men from St Elizabeth Ann Seton parish held their 12<sup>th</sup> annual retreat at the beautiful and tranquil St Anthony's Retreat Center at Three Rivers, January 24-26. The center is perfect for fellowship, individual reflection, and group instruction. Father Jim Nisbet returned for the 7th year and provided a thought-provoking journey from the teachings of Saint Peter, as they apply to living in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. This year's retreat was the largest attendance we have had, and of the group, 18 men were there for the first time.

We arrived over a warm, sunny afternoon on Friday, January 24, and were greeted by half-a-dozen wild turkeys. Friday afternoon is filled with room check-in, getting oriented to the center, and greeting friends from years' past. The retreat officially begins with Mass, celebrated by Fr. Jim, at 6pm. The first instructional session is that evening following dinner. Friday evening closes with fellowship and hospitality.

Mass is also held on Saturday and Sunday mornings before breakfast. There are a total of 4 instructional sessions over the course of the retreat, each followed by a small group discussion led by men who have attended previously. The small group sessions are to reinforce the instruction from the session, and for sharing personal experiences.

The instructional sessions are scheduled to ensure ample time for fellowship, individual reflection, walking the beautiful grounds, or reading. A highlight of each retreat is Fr. Jim's walking instruction in the beautiful Stations of the Cross grotto. Year after year, every attendee joins this amazing experience. Following dinner on Saturday there is an optional movie which is always a religiously based theme and educational. Saturday afternoon or evening has the Sacrament of Reconciliation available when possible.

Sunday morning Mass is a teaching mass before breakfast. The final instructional session follows and is closed by a retreat debrief.

We always learn from each other, and the retreat gets stronger every year. The 13<sup>th</sup> Annual SEAS Men's Retreat is scheduled, and already booked at St Anthony's Retreat Center, for **Friday**, **January 23 – Sunday**, **January 25**, **2026**. **Please put it on your calendars**.
