CONGRESSMAN HENRY HYDE

Right to Life most quoted [remarks](#) in Congress are unforgettable:

When the time comes as it surely will, when we face that awesome moment, the final judgement, I've often thought, as Fulton Sheen wrote, that it is a terrible moment of loneliness. You have no advocates, you are there alone standing before God, and a terror will rip through your soul like nothing you can imagine. But I really think that those in the pro-life movement will not be alone. I think there will be a chorus of voices that have never been heard in this world but are heard beautifully and clearly in the next world, and they will plead for everyone who has been in this movement. They will say to God, "Spare him because he loved us," and God will look at you and say not "Did you succeed?" but "Did you try?"

But there was also this, from the House floor in 1993. He talked about the “cry of the heart” from the unborn:

- The French have a marvelous gift for phrasemaking. And one of their marvelous phrases is *cri de coeur*. A cry of the heart. . . .
- There are two cries of the heart in every human being's life.
- The very first cry of the heart occurs in the womb. And if you ever look at a sonogram picture . . . that is when the first *cri de coeur* occurs.
- *I want to be born.*
- It is a reflection of instinct, the urge to survive.
- It is inaudible but it is there.
- *I want to be born.*
- And the second cry of the heart is at the end of your life. It's the last thing you say: *I don't want to die. I don't want to die.*
- Abortion violates both of that *cri de coeur*.
- It violates your right to be born, your right to life, which our Declaration says is a fundamental endowment and it is inalienable, the right to life.

Listen to the cry.

MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

Membership: At the end of our 2025 calendar year, the council had 210 members. Our newest arrivals are David Witt, and Jim Patten—who is rejoining the Council from online membership. Please welcome them both into Council 14754.

We are also at the mid-year point of our fraternal year. For fraternal year 2025-2026, our six months of progress show the addition of seventeen members. Twelve of these are new members and the other five are transfers from other councils. In July we also moved thirteen members to online membership due to not paying dues. Given the additions and deductions, we have a net gain of four members over the course of the last six months.
