October is the beginning of our annual dues cycle. At our October meeting we distributed the 2024 dues bills to attendees, and accepted dues payments by cash, check, and credit card. We will also accept dues payments by cash, check, and credit card at our November, December, and January 2024 meetings. Dues bills not picked up at our November meeting will be mailed. All 2024 dues should be paid by January 15, 2024. Members can pay their 2024 dues 24/7 on our council website. Despite the state increasing its annual per capita assessment per member from \$11 to \$13 our annual council dues remain at \$48 for regular members, and \$10 for honorary members. We can keep our dues unchanged thanks to members who are able to pay optional dues of up to \$20 or even more depending on their financial ability.

Coats For Kids: Donations are still coming in for our 2023 Coats For Kids fundraiser, but at this point we have over \$11,000 raised including \$520 in donations made on our council website. Final numbers should be available by the end of October.

The rest of the How To Join page consists of some 18 paragraphs that provide all the details, but those who do not like to read "the fine print" simply need to follow the two Click HERE prompts. I don't know about you, but when I buy a car, I would rather not have to deal with hundreds of pages of owner's manuals. I just what to jump in and drive.

By emailing our membership director prospects must provide their full name, email, and cell phone number so we can contact them. By downloading our council's membership application (which replaces the olde Form 100 that older members had to deal with) prospects provide us with all the information necessary for us to make an admission decision. I am not going to waste newsletter space here by displaying our council's membership application, but I strongly recommend that all existing members at least download it from our webpage and become familiar with its content. In that way you could always print it out for prospects who prefer to go the old school pen and ink hard copy route.

Who are prospects? Any man not currently a member of our council is a prospect. So that would include all the possibilities above. That means that every prospect needs to complete our council's membership application (brand new Knights, former Knights, and existing Knights wanting to transfer into our council from another council).

Shortly we will be preparing business card stock to have available to hand out to prospects. The idea is to have these cards available at the SEAS office for men who inquire there about Knight membership, and to make enough of a supply to give existing members so, rather than hand out tons of printed literature, these cards will lead prospects to our webpage and get everything they wanted to know about the Knights. Existing members can easily bring up our webpage on their cell phones (or a prospect's cell phone) and easily walk them thru the process.

Is the olde Form 100 still used? If a council uses the online member management application available to Financial Secretaries and Grand Knights the venerable Form 100 is only needed to advise the supreme membership department of members a council needs to suspend for nonpayment of dues or other suspension causes. All membership additions are now done digitally using the supreme application, and even deceased members are digitally reported.

Are there other online resources for prospects to learn about Knight membership? I like to think that our council's website is the best place for one stop shopping about the Knights. Our council recently earned a recognition plaque for "best website" from the California State council so perhaps I'm correct. On the other hand, prospects can go directly to any of the websites that we link to from our webpage. Here are the links we show:
