Invoices for food and supplies submitted to our Treasurer for payment totaled \$452.86. October is a busy Month! About 10 SEAS PitMasters prepared chicken for the annual SVDP dinner on Thursday Oct 4th. Gordon Fisher June 10, 1937 – September 7, 2024 Gordon joined our council in 2017 when he



and his wife transferred from St. Philip to SEAS. He was a full colonel and loved to take parishioners on tours of military installations through his connections in the retired military officers association. I had a chance to meet with Gordon at his home shortly after he joined our council, and he told two stories about his military career that I would like to share.


Early in his military career during the Cold War he served in Germany with the 24th Infantry Division where he was a helicopter pilot and commanded a mechanized infantry company that he described as the tip of the spear. This was because his unit was stationed by the Fulda Gap which was the primary route the Russians would have used to invade eastern Germany, and his unit would have been the first to engage them.

When he was having his home in Bakersfield built he still had to maintain his active pilot status, so he would fly his helicopter stationed in San Diego up to Bakersfield and back each week to view the construction progress. Back then there was plenty of open land around his house, and Gordon pointed out where he would land so he could simply walk over to the construction site.

ST VINCENT DePaul HOMELESS CENTER BREAKFAST, by Craig Holliday

On the morning of Saturday, September 28th, 2024, a crew of 10 Knights (and four Knights family members) prepared breakfast at the St Vincent de Paul Center on Baker Street. The event was planned by Past Grand Knight Michael Dhanens. The menu included scrambled eggs, potatoes, sausage, and tortillas. Work started at about 6:30 a.m. with the cracking of eggs, the peeling and dicing of potatoes, and the cooking of sausage. After two hours of prep work, the food was served at 8:30 a.m. Center staff reported that we served about 240 people. As one of the people who was serving on the line, I can vouch that there were definitely people who came back for seconds (and some thirds). People eating breakfast were very happy with us. In our September newsletter I reported that our council earned star council recognition for the 2023/24 fraternal year. Here is a listing of the major activities we reported in our Columbian Award Application which is part of the star council criteria.

FAITH PROGRAMS:

We provided \$2,000 in financial aid to seminarian Francisco Orozco.

We conducted the 5th Sunday rosary program.

We provided sacramental gifts to Fr. Jimmy Milan and Deacon martin Ortega, both of whom were prior seminarians assigned to our parish.

We supported the Annual Catholic Men's Retreat in Three Rivers, CA with 46 attendees lead by Fr. Jim Nesbit.

FAMILY PROGRAMS:

We conducted the parish annual Thanksgiving and Christmas food drives to benefit Catholic Charities in Bakersfield and continued our monthly food bin deliveries to Catholic Charities. (See cumulative food drive information in the report below.) We have a Knight of the month, and Knight of the year program, and a Family of the Year recognition program.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS:

We do an annual Coats For Kids drive. (See cumulative Coats For Kids information in the report below.)

We do several breakfasts at the St Vincent DePaul homeless center.

We provide the pancake breakfast for the annual Mom's group 5K run at SEAS.

We donate to the SEAS Ladies Ministry Fellowship for their assistance in assisting with our Lent Friday fish dinners.

LIFE PROGRAMS:

We support local Right To Life groups including Kern Right To Life and the Bakersfield Pregnancy Center.

The report below provides detail of the last three fraternal years of both council parish support and donations and parish fundraising done by the council. It also provides cumulative data for the thirteen years ending June 30, 2024. Although our council began its operations in April 2009, it was not until the year ending June 30, 2012, that we were able to provide significant parish support and donation programs.

Since 2017 the only continuing fundraising done by our council is our annual Lent Friday fish dinners. In general, none of the parish ministries conduct significant individual fundraising efforts since the focus on fundraising at SEAS is through parishwide activities to raise funds for running the parish and our parish building fund.
