Our council once again earned star council recognition. This latest star was for the year ended June 30, 2024, the 15th year since our council's founding in 2009. We now have a total of five star council awards (years 2, 6, 7, 9, and 15). Three other councils in our Kern/Inyo chapter also earned star council recognition for the last fraternal year. They were, 977 St. Francis (the oldest council in Kern County), 2938 St John's in Wasco, and 9530 St Philip.

There is a complete KofC publication covering the requirements to become recognized as a star council which includes doing at least four activities under each of the four program areas (Faith, Family, Community, Life), meeting membership growth quotas, promotion of Knight insurance programs, and timely filing of all required reports to the supreme council.
